HISTORICAL CHARACTERS

Judith Shakespeare

Judith was William Shakespeare's second daughter and Hamnet's twin sister.

At age 31, Judith married Thomas Quiney, the 26 year old son of a prominent local family. The pair were married in Lent of 1616. Scandal ensued when Thomas' lover gave birth to his son one month after the wedding.

In her father's will, Judith received £150 and a silver gilt bowl, plus additional money if she and her children survived another 3 years. This sum is considerably less than what was bequeathed to her older sister Susanna.

In 1616, shortly after her father passed away, Judith gave birth to a son named Shakespeare. Her other two sons, Thomas and Richard, followed a couple of years later but all three died before adulthood.

A document signed in 1611 by the witnesses of a property sale list Judith Shakespeare, however her signature is merely a mark. It is believed that Judith was never taught to write, however it is likely given her status in society she would likely have been able to read.

Susanna Shakespeare

Susanna was baptised on 26th May 1583, six months after her parents, William Shakespeare and Anne Hathaway, were married. Susanna married John Hall, a physician, at Holy Trinity Church on 5 June 1607. Their only child, Elizabeth, was born on 21 February 1608. It is believed that the family moved into their Stratford home Hall's Croft as soon as it was built in 1613.

Scholars assume that Susanna was educated and literate, as she could at

least write her name and is thought to have composed the memorial epitaph to her mother.

William Shakespeare left Susanna and husband the bulk of his estate and it is believed she was left his papers. It is likely that she had some involvement with the compilation of the First Folio of Shakespeare's works.

Jillian Willems (She/Her)- Select performance credits include Beautiful: The Carole King Musical (RMTC); Merrily We Roll Along (Dry Cold); Antigone (Sick&Twisted/AA Battery); Cinderella (Rainbow); South Pacific (Rainbow/WSO) Select creative credits include Afterlight (Director/The Keep, Walk&Talk, Rainbow); Into the Woods (Choreographer/RMTC); Hansel & Gretel (Director/MUO); The Snail and the Whale (Director/MTYP); Pippin (Choreographer, WST/ViC); Breaking Up is Hard to Do (Choreographer, Rainbow Stage); American Idiot (Choreographer, WST). This is for the women in my life making big moves both publicly and by candlelight in a tavern.



Hrotsvitha 930-1002

A German writer, thought to be the first female playwright. She spent most of her life as a nun, although she did not take the vow of poverty, which meant she was known as a canoness. She is credited with writing six plays as well as eight poems.

Francesca Caccini (1587-1641)

One of the first women known to compose opera, she was a singer and composer in the early Baroque era.

Lavinia Fontana (1552–1614)

Is credited with being the first professional female visual artist. She was the first woman artist to paint female nudes, and possibly the first female to use live nude female models. She was the primary breadwinner for herself, her husband and their eleven children.



Aphra Behn (1640-1689):

Became one of the period's foremost playwrights. She caused scandal with some of her subjects, her work often alluding to sexual desire. Aphra responded to the accusations of impropriety that the works would not have been criticized if a man had written them. Aphra is remembered in Virginia Woolf's *A Room of One's Own*: "All women together ought to let flowers fall upon the tomb of Aphra Behn...for it was she who earned them the right to speak their minds."



Margaret Hughes (1660).

Margaret "Peggy" Hughes is thought to be the first woman to 'trod the boards' of the British stage, playing the part of Desdemona in the new King's Company production of Shakespeare's *Othello*. A beautiful woman, Margaret was as well-known for her romantic dalliances as she was for her performances. She was very confident and aware of the power that her attractiveness gave her, and saw little to be gained from being modest.

Marie Sallé (1707-1756)

Was a pioneering French ballerina and choreographer who made significant contributions to the development of ballet. She was one of the first female dancers to gain recognition as a leading performer and choreographer, helping to pave the way for future generations of female ballet artists.



Eva Le Gallienne (1926)

Founded the Civic Repertory Theatre in New York City to present classics and important foreign plays at low admission prices. Through her productions and translations, she introduced American audiences to the works of Anton Chekhov, Henrik Ibsen, and others; she directed and acted in most of the theatre's productions.

Lorraine Hansberry (1959):

First Black Woman to have a Play Produced on Broadway. *A Raisin in the Sun* was also named the year's best by the New York Drama Critics' Circle. Lorraine passed away from cancer at age 34. Lorraine is the namesake for The Hansberry Project, a theatre company dedicated to celebrating, supporting, and presenting the work of Black theatre artists.



Judy Garland (1962)

The first woman to win a Grammy Award for Album of the Year, winning for her live album "Judy at Carnegie Hall."

Dolly Parton (1978)

The first Woman to Win the Country Music Association's (CMA) Entertainer of the Year and went on to become the first woman to own her own record label in 2007.



Andrea Martin (1993)

First Canadian Actress to Win a Tony Award for Best Featured Actress in a Musical: for her role in "My Favorite Year".

Julie Taymor (1998)

The first woman to win the Tony Award for Best Director for "*The Lion King*." She also created more than 100 puppets for the performers winning her the Tony for best costume design as well. *The Lion King* became one of the longest running musicals on Broadway.

Lynn Nottage

First & Only Woman to win a Pulitzer Prize for Drama Twice. In 2009 for *Ruined* and again in 2017 for *Sweat*. This puts her in the company of fellow playwrights Tennessee Williams, Thornton Wilder.

Katherine Bigelow (2010)

The first woman to win an Academy Award for Best Director, winning for the film "The Hurt Locker."



Misty Copeland (2015)

Was promoted to principal dancer at the American Ballet Theatre making her the first African American Performer in that position in the company's 75 year history.


Kelly Thornton (2019)

2019 becomes the first woman to hold the position of Artistic Director at the Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre in Winnipeg since the company's founding in 1958.
